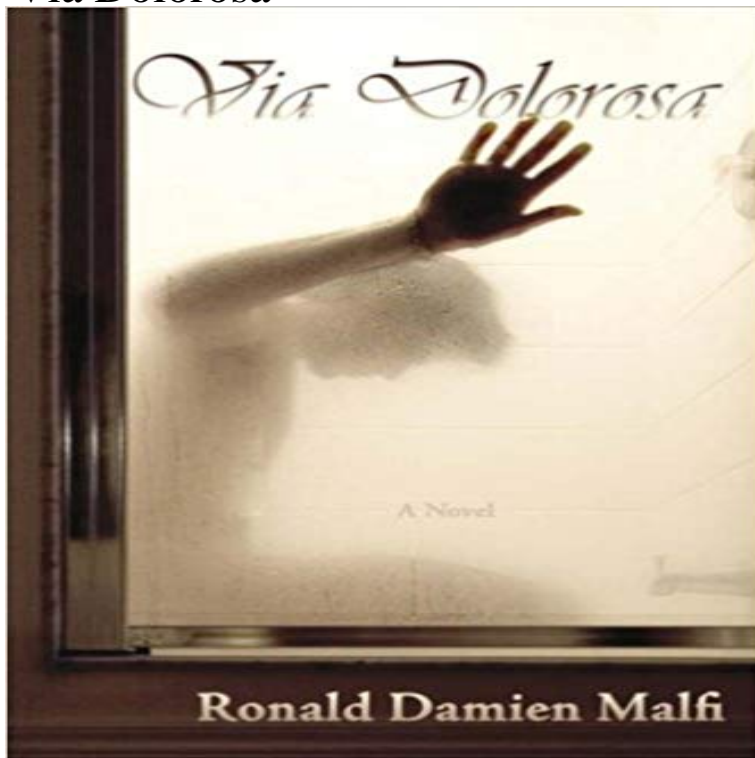


Via Dolorosa

The stations grew out of imitations of Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem which is Pilgrims have retraced the steps of the Crucifixion of Jesus in Jerusalem, Israel since before the eighth century. The Stations of the Cross are stops that commemorate events during the torture, sentencing, carrying of the cross, crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus.
