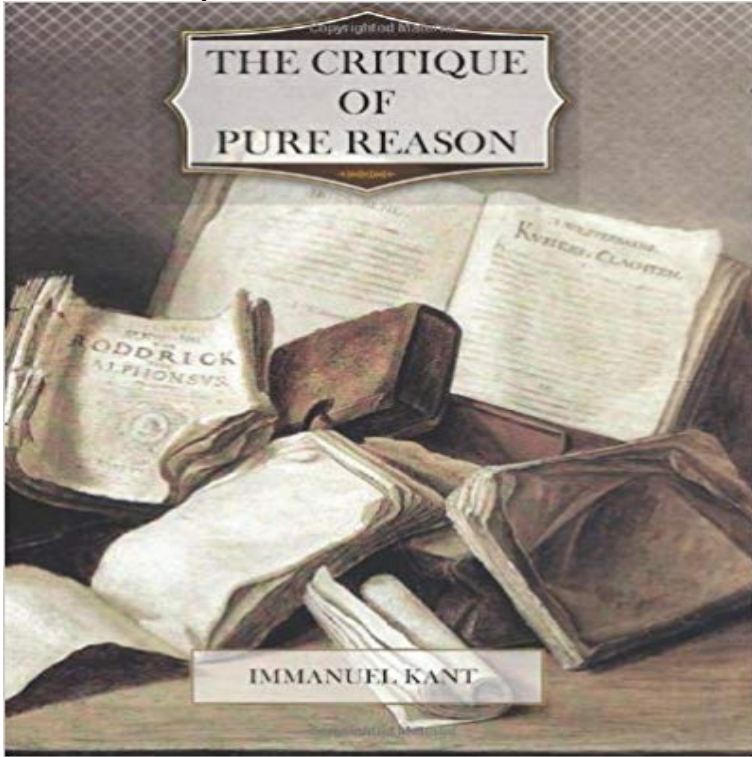


The Critique of Pure Reason
